TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME AUGUST 16, 2015

What keeps the world from seeking and finding God? Part of the answer has to do with how we see God. If God is a stern and demanding Judge, we feel we will lose more than we gain by seeking God. If God is a gracious and forgiving Lord, we feel we do not deserve such forgiveness and acceptance. Where is your God? In a celestial law court, or in the midst of your life?

First reading – Proverbs 9:1-6

A formal education these days is increasingly costly. Wisdom, however, is available without charge to all who seek her gifts. We can feast at the table of wisdom without paying a dime. All we need to do is open our minds and our hearts to the source of all wisdom and knowledge.

Second reading – Ephesians 5: 15-20

The Apostle Paul never tired of thanking God for the gift of Jesus Christ. Paul had struggled throughout his life to achieve the rewards that came from obedience to the Law of Moses. But he found what he had been truly seeking in the sheer grace that God bestowed in Jesus Christ.


Gospel – John 6:51-58

Jesus Christ gave himself for the salvation of the world. This gift is renewed each time we receive the bread and the wine. Receiving the gift of unmerited grace, however, is not easy. It means letting go of all claims to our own goodness and all efforts to provide salvation for ourselves.

Children often ask simple yet provocative questions. One such question is: "Where is God?" Ask yourself that question. Is God in heaven? But where is heaven? Is God "out there," beyond time and space? No doubt it is true, but it makes God extremely remote. Or is God present in the lives of the saints and other chosen people? Yes, but where does that leave you? Consider: Isn't the only God we can know in a personal way the God who lives within us?


Psalm 34 is helpful here. Instead of arguing for the existence of God, the psalmist issues an invitation to experience God: "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord." Our Proverbs reading today has Wisdom saying, "Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed ... and walk in the way of insight." We must open ourselves to experiencing God. Jesus said in today's Gospel: "My flesh is real food, and my blood real drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood remain in me, and I in them." He was saying that we can take his life into our lives. We can experience Christ on the inside, where we hurt and hope, laugh and cry.

To be sure, the Bible presents many different pictures of God. Some of them are mind-boggling in scope. Genesis presents God as almighty Creator, whose voice spoke all things into existence, the One who started with nothing and made everything. Exodus says Moses talked with God on a mountain that was capped with clouds and shaken by thunder, and Moses came down from the mountain with the Ten Commandments. Isaiah had a vision of God "seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple." These pictures come from the Old Testament, and they are valid in that we need to think big thoughts about God. But if we think of God only in such ways, how are we ever going to know God ---- who seems so far away and unapproachable? Our deepest need is to know that we are loved and cared for by the One who is the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the Creator and Redeemer of all things --- past, present, and future. May the God you experience be the One from whom and through whom and to whom are all things. Amen. Have a Blessed Week! Fr. Festus

ST. GERALD LITURGICAL VESSELS BLESSED

Various liturgical vessels were sent "into the shop" to be re-plated and they came back looking like new.

The six communion chalices, the luna of the Monstrance, the Monstrance and the chalice that the late Fr. Jim Wright used at St. Alexander. Also re-plated were the holy water bucket and sprinkler. Fr. Festus performed a very short blessing ceremony in the sacristy. Thank you to generous donors who provided the funds for this work.

What is a monstrance? "A receptacle, usually made of gold or silver, with a transparent container in which the consecrated host is exposed for adoration. Word origin: from Latin: *Monstrare*—to show. The luna is the round, transparent container which hold the consecrated host for adoration. It is placed in the center of the circle where it is visible for all to see. On the first Fridays and other events, the monstrance is used for Eucharistic Adoration.
