TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SEPTEMBER 6, 2015

Studies of human perception have shown that we hear many sounds that we do not understand, such as an unknown foreign language. But sometimes we do not understand what we are hearing because we are not listening. We often do not know what we are hearing on television because our minds are a thousand miles away. Understanding requires listening.

First reading – Isaiah 35:4-7a

Listening is a vital reality in the faith of ancient Israel. Listening, expressed in the Hebrew word "shema" ("hear"), pertains to the covenantal bond between God and Israel. The prophet Isaiah promised that God would eventually vindicate the righteous and bless the penitents. But his hopeful words fell on deaf ears if the people were not listening.

Second reading - James 2:1-5

James warned against drawing invidious distinctions between the rich and the poor. He had no tolerance for people who were honored solely because of their wealth or fame. James insisted that people who hear and respond to the word of God are all blessed and equal in the eyes of God.

Gospel – Mark 7:31-37

No problem was too great for the Lord Christ to solve. Jesus cured leprosy, cast out demons, and raised the dead. One of his most important healing miracles was restoring hearing to the deaf, many of whom were unable to speak. Through this miracle of healing a new world was opened for people who knew only silence.

If you can remember your childhood, you may recall an experience like this. Your mother or father is giving you words of chastisement and correction, telling you in no uncertain terms precisely what you must stop doing or start doing. Suddenly your parent stops talking, looks at you sternly and curiously, and asks, "Are you listening?" It's a good question, because even in childhood we learn how to hear what we want to hear and tune out the rest. This isn't a trait that ends with childhood, however. Listening seems more and more to be a lost art, and we often hear only what we want to hear.

Our hearts go out to the man in today's Gospel reading. He could not hear. Because he could not hear, his ability to speak was impaired. His story, however, has a happy ending. Friends brought him to Jesus, and Jesus healed him. He was able to hear clearly and speak plainly. Whatever we make of the miraculous element in this story, we might consider what a miracle it would be if our own hearing problem could be healed. This man's deafness was apparently physical in nature. Our deafness is more often spiritual in nature. Something is wrong in our hearts and minds. The main reason most of us do not hear is because we do not listen. There is more to hearing than having good ears. Elderly people sometimes tell us that the only way they can hear any more is to pay very close attention. This is understandable. But the truth is that the only way for any of us to hear is to pay attention. This is the explanation of deafness from which many of us suffer. Hearing involves more than sound waves coming into contact with auditory nerves! Communication is one of the primary building blocks of human relationships. It is also the glue that holds the building blocks together. When people try to explain the break-up of their marriages, one of the most frequently cited reasons is a lack of communication. Usually it does not mean that one partner in the marriage has stopped talking, but that one or both partners have stopped listening. Notice the sequence in the story for today. First, Jesus opened the man's ears. Then, he was healed of his impediment and he began to speak plainly. This is how it always is: first the hearing, then the speaking. Have a Blessed Week! Fr. Tim's Tidbits, by Tim Westfall

I would just like to say how fortunate I feel to have been given the opportunity to serve the People of St. Gerald Parish in the capacity of Pastoral Associate. My hope, over the course of our journey together, is to come to know each of you.

I have been meeting since late August with Peggy about responsibilities and history of the parish community. I have met the warm and friendly staff and look forward to working with them. It will be a privilege to serve the people of this parish community under the guidance of Fr. Festus and the Holy Spirit.

I will only say a wee bit about myself at this time and will tell more as we journey together. My hobbies include collecting hand-wound clocks, some golf, decorating and working on my family genealogy. I have traced my family back to their country of origin – Poland, Germany and Prussia. I am thankful to have met two of my great grandfathers, as all of my great grandparents were in America. One set of great great grandparents, on my maternal side, came to America in 1889 and 1890 and were married at St. Francis D' Assisi Church in Detroit in 1891. 

Thanks to Fr. Festus, Fr. Roodbeen for Their Help in Landing 11 Prospects at Last Sunday's Recruiting Effort

A Big "Atta Boy" to Membership Director Shatomi Kerbawy for his presentation at last weekend's masses and for his leadership in a recruiting drive that netted 11 solid prospects. Shatomi gave a short but inspiring talk at the tail end of the masses, recounting how membership in the K of C has affected his life. The prospects will be contacted. Fr. Festus, our Chaplain and the celebrant at three of the four weekend masses, gave the Council a solid plug as did the other Sunday celebrant, Fr. Henry Roodbeen who is a member of St. Colette Council. **Thank you, brother Knights**. We had a solid turnout for our Family Communion mass, filling five pews. Knights also filled two of the five usher spots, carried the cross to the altar and presented the gifts. A strong showing and a fine example for the parish.

Members at the Aug. 18 meeting approved a donation of \$200 to aid Chaldean Catholics fleeing the ISIS. One of the attendees at the District 12 summer meeting last month recounted how his brother, a priest, fled his small Syrian village steps ahead of ISIS gunmen intent on capture. The speaker is a member of Council 9154, affiliated with St. George Church in Shelby Twp., a Chaldean parish. The national K of C also is conducting a drive to provide aid to middle eastern Christians fleeing ISIS. It was disclosed at that meeting that the February dinner held the last four years to support pregnancy crisis centers will not take place in 2016. Instead the six area councils were urged to conduct their own drives to assist the centers. **How our Council will do that is being discussed by your officers.**

Brother Larry Swanson has agreed to lead the Food for Families program, an effort emanating from the national K of C. In addition to boosting our local pantries, the program will earn our council a rebate of \$100 in national dues if we collect 1,000 pounds of food and provide 100 man hours collecting and distributing food for the needy. For the most part we already are reaching those goals, but no one is tracking the effort. More details in later articles.

We again will be cooking pancakes for the parish after the 8:30 and 10:15 AM masses Sept. 27. Brother Dave Bednarski, the manager for this event, will be circulating a sign up sheet at the Sept. 15 membership meeting. However, be sure to reserve that date now. About 30 Knights are needed from 8 a.m. to Noon to provide a pancake breakfast, the single biggest usage of our manpower during the year.


