TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SEPTEMBER 13, 2015

The cross of Christ is memorialized in many different ways. Huge crosses bearing the likeness of the Savior hang over the altars of our churches. Tiny crosses free of all adornments are worn on chains around our necks. But the most memorial to the cross of Christ are the crosses we bear in the living of our faith and our obedient discipleship.

First reading – Isaiah 50:5-9a

In such a world as ours, offering a helping hand is much more difficult than giving advice to those in need. Jesus taught the truths of God, but he also gave his life on a criminal's cross for a world of sinful people. Those of us who would follow him must not withhold ourselves from a hostile and a helpless world.

Second reading – James 2:14-18

Talk is cheap, especially in the realm of faith. All our talk about clothing the naked and feeding the hungry is a mockery of Christian compassion if it costs us nothing. Only those who are willing to take up a cross of service are worthy to be called the disciples of Jesus Christ.

Gospel – Mark 8 8:27-35

The logic of the cross of Christ contradicts everything the world teaches about successful living and getting ahead. Faith's truth contradicts the popular wisdom of this misdirected world. Strange as it seems, those who live under the shadow of the cross can receive only by giving, win only by losing, and live only by dying.

Popular Christianity today tends to be too comfortable, which makes it hard to be taken seriously. But this is not new. The history of the church reveals how Christians have always tried to make faith as simple and as easy as possible. We have an example in today's reading. Peter had just made his confession that Jesus was the Messiah. Then Jesus began to teach the disciples what kind of Messiah he would be. He told them of the coming days of his suffering, his rejection, and his death. The disciples could not have been more shocked. Peter took Jesus aside and rebuked him. But Jesus turned on Peter and said, "Get out of my sight, you Satan!" Then Jesus gathered all the disciples and said, "If any wish to come after me, they must deny themselves, take up their crosses, and follow in my steps." Are we called to the way of the cross?

The cross was never for Christ only. It has always been for his followers as well. The cross stands at the center of the Christian faith. Without it, Jesus would not have been the Christ. Without it, we cannot be his followers. The cross is central to our faith for several reasons. First, it reveals the true nature of sin. Sin is not just a specialty of religion. It is a very real fact of human life. Sin is why our governments spend millions of dollars on police officers and jails, law courts and prisons. Why else have the nations of the world spent themselves into bankruptcy making machines that do nothing but kill people? Sin is the deepest problem of the human race, and this would be the case even if religion ceased to exist.

The cross is central to our faith because it reveals the way of true faith. Faith is not always a good thing. We are called on to have faith in our political leaders, but some politicians are crooks. Faith in dishonest politicians is bad faith. It may have seemed grim and foreboding to have spoken of the cross as revealing the true nature of sin, the power of sacrificial living, and a cross-shaped faith. But this is the only kind of Christian faith that has a chance in the real world. In their deepest hearts, people despise a soft and easy religion. The causes that call for our response are dangerous and demanding. The church cannot face this world at a lower level of devotion. The way of the cross is the only way. Have a Blessed Week! Fr. At age 70, priests in the Archdiocese of Detroit begin receiving a \$1,500 monthly pension and health and automobile insurance from the Priests' Pension Plan. The Archdiocese annually assesses each parish \$15,644 per priest serving there to support this fund.

Next weekend, September 19 and 20, our parish will take up a special collection to help defray the cost of this assessment and to show our appreciation for those priests who have cared for us and ministered to us throughout the years. Pulled Pork Sandwiches and Pancake Breakfast Sign Up Featured at Tuesday's Membership Meeting

When the members meet again Tuesday they will have an opportunity to sign up to help with the September 27 pancake breakfast. As in the past, the Council will serve pancakes with the trimmings for parishioners after the 8:30AM and 10:15 AM masses that day. Net proceeds will go to the St. Gerald St. Vincent de Paul Society which does so much good work in the parish.

Dave Bednarski is the event chairman and will be circulating a signup sheet. Workers should wear their Council shirts, aprons and, if handling food, a cap. If you don't have a Council apron with our logo, you can earn one by working at five events in three years and having attained the second and third degrees of our Order. We have several members who are eligible for a free apron, but lack the advanced degrees. There are degree ceremonies happening monthly; see GK Darren Losey for details.

Bring your appetite to the meeting, we will be serving pulled pork sandwiches and appropriate beverages. It is rumored that Fred Gerometta found the pork recipe, a family secret for years, last month while attending a family reunion in Italy.

At the officers meeting Sept. 1, GK Losey, appointed part of a Scholarship committee to investigate if the Council can afford to award scholarships and how it could be done. He will be asking for two volunteers to join DGK Fred Gerometta and Program Director Tom McPhail on that committee.

On a national scale, the Supreme Council awarded scholarships worth more than \$1.06 million to 519 students for the 2014-15 academic year. Most recipients are the children of Knights or Knights themselves attending Catholic universities or Catholic colleges in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico or the Philippines. The figures include \$266,275 given seminarians in the U.S. and Canada. For more information on the Order's scholarship program, visit kofc.org/scholarships.
