THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME NOVEMBER 15, 2015

Ours is a disturbing and fearsome time. Old traditions no longer have their binding power. Laws seem to be made to be broken. The hinges of sanity are coming loose for an increased number of people. Children have embraced the violence of adults, and adults have reverted to childish immaturity. Where is there solid ground to stand on in this uncertain world?

First reading – Daniel 12:1-3

The prophet Daniel foresaw a time when the earth would be consumed by violence and by destruction. Yet he promised the faithful that God's mighty arm would see them through the worst times. Those who believed Daniel's message would be spared and ultimately given eternal life.

Second reading – Hebrews 10:11-14, 18

Although we live in a bleak and uncertain world, we have the assurance that God's victory over sin and death has already been won. Christ has already paid the price for our sins. He has already suffered death on our behalf. Nothing that can ever happen to us will spell defeat, because Christ has won the victory for those of us who trust in him.

Gospel – Mark 13:24-32

Jesus was straightforward and clear in his assurances to the disciples. Nothing can harm us as long as we trust in his words. The heavens may fly into pieces. The earth may be consumed by fire. But the words of Jesus empower us to withstand any test, suffer any loss, and lose any treasure.

The words of Jesus sometimes seem strange, and make us doubtful. Yet, upon a closer look, they can invariably be seen to be the truth of God and in our best interest. For example, Jesus said, "Whoever would be the greatest among you must be last of all and servant of all." (Mk 9:35) We may not like it, but it has proven over and over again to be true. And what could science ever discover that would nullify that truth? What new worlds in the far reaches of space could be found where that principle did not hold? Our own cherished culture may fade and disappear. But whatever may take its place, it will still be true that the greatest among us will be those who freely and gladly become servants.

The remarkable thing is that Jesus saw this so long ago. In the midst of a world that was based on force and violence, he quietly and confidently lived and taught his truth. Where others hated, he loved. Where others demanded to be served, he freely gave himself in service to others, even to the point of dying. What chance did such a man of sorrows have in this kind of world/ Look around you! The Roman Empire, with its might and majesty, long ago faded from view. No one today swears allegiance to Caesar. But the gospel of Jesus Christ lives in the hearts and in the lives of millions of people today. To date, Jesus' confidence in his mission is well justified. In this rapidly changing world, what does the future hold for you and me? We do not know, but we need not be greatly troubled about it. Jesus said, "The heavens and the earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." Amid the shifting sands of our world today the truth of Christ remains.
