FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT NOVEMBER 29, 2015

The true measure of courage is not how many battles we have won, but how many defeats we have overcome. The people who deserve our admiration have been knocked around by life, but they have always come back for more. Standing up to life, no matter what happens, is the mark of real courage, as well as faith.

First reading – Jeremiah 33:14-16

In the life of the prophet Jeremiah, God has set the pattern of persistence. God has maintained his covenant commitment with the people of Israel through all manner of circumstances, both good and bad. God will raise up a messenger of truth and hope from the dead stump of his people's forgotten faith.

Second reading - 1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2

The apostle Paul understood the spiritual life for what it was, a continual battle. Love is to be cherished, but does not come easily when we are dealing with a careless and calloused world. Strong hearts filled with the love of Christ is what is needed if the people of God are to stand up to such a world.

Gospel – Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

Jesus was candid and upfront with his disciples about the dire things that lay in their future. It would be as if the heavens crashed and the earth burned. But those are the times when faith will see us through. Faith is our most precious resource. It will give us the strength to stiffen our backbones and stand up to whatever happens.

Our reading today begins with Jesus painting a grim picture of human life. He speaks of entire nations being in anguish, of authorities being threatened, and of people being fearful of death. He was speaking of difficult times that are coming. The disciples will face a daunting future. But Jesus went on to say, "When these things begin to happen, stand up straight and raise your heads." This was how Jesus wanted them to face what was coming. It is how we are to face the future, as well. When life is hard, we still have a choice. We can lie down and quit, or we can stand up in faith and face what comes. In order to do this, we must first accept responsibility for ourselves. We must hold ourselves accountable for our lives. When we fail, the first place to look for the reason is within ourselves. In saying this, however, we still know that, to some degree, every one of us is a victim. We did not choose to be born in our confused and confusing generation. It is not our fault that the world is in turmoil, that historical institutions are crumbling, and that many moral values are in question. But we must accept responsibility for ourselves. Otherwise, we don't have a chance!

The parents of a teenage girl suddenly filed for divorce. The girl was confused, angry and frightened. She went to her priest for help. He said, "You have encountered a situation you did not ask for, and don't deserve. No one who knows what happened will blame you if you spend the next five years being angry. But, for your own sake, you do not have to use your time that way. There is a better way, and you can choose that." The girl was not responsible for what happened in her world, but she could hold herself accountable for the response she made to it. George Bernard Shaw wrote: "People are always blaming their circumstance for what they are. I don't believe in circumstances. The people who get on in this world are those who get up and look for the circumstances they want, and, if they can't find them, make them."



OPLATEK OR "CHRISTMAS WAFER"

The Christmas wafer is a Central European Christian Christmas tradition celebrated in Polish, Slovak, Lithuanian and Italian families during Wigilia (Christmas Eve Vigil). The unleavened wafers are baked from pure wheat flour and water, are usually rectangular in shape and very thin; they are identical in composition to the Host used during a Catholic mass however, they are not consecrated. Wafers are embossed with Christmas related religious images, varying from the nativity scene, especially Virgin Mary with baby Jesus, to the Star of Bethlehem. Family members and friends break off a small piece of the oplatek wafer and give it to one another along with a blessing. Breaking off and exchanging part of oplatek with someone is symbol of forgiveness between two people and is meant to remind participants of the importance of Christmas, God, and family. The tradition of sharing the wafer is one of the rich variety of traditions that Poles still celebrate during Christmas Eve Supper, which is the most elegant evening in the whole year. Why not start a new tradition this year. Oplateks are available in the Parish Office and will be available after all the Masses on the weekend December 5 and 6. A Free Will donation is not required, but would be appreciated!
