

#### FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**February 7, 2016** 

In the Gospel reading for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we hear Luke's account of the call of the first disciples. Unlike the other Evangelists, Luke places a spotlight on the call of Simon Peter in this call narrative. As the author of the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles (Luke–Acts), Luke is not just telling the story of Jesus, he is also telling the story of the early church. Since Peter is a central figure in both the life of Jesus and the life of the early church, Luke viewed the call of the disciples as a prime opportunity to introduce and highlight Peter.

Luke knew Mark's version of the call of the disciples (see Mk 1:16-20). It was a rather matter-of-fact report of Jesus calling the set of brother fishermen, Peter and Andrew, James and John, to follow him. Mark offers few additional details beyond all four responding positively to Jesus' invitation. In Luke's retelling of the call, Andrew is not mentioned at all, James and John play a very minor role, a miraculous catch of fish is added, and the interaction between Jesus and Simon Peter is the main focus. Luke portrays Peter as a humble and trusting man, well aware of his own limitations. In the various ways in which he redacts Mark's call narrative, Luke actually transforms the "call" of Simon Peter into a "commission" narrative. Jesus not only invites Peter to follow him, he commissions Peter—"From now on you will be catching men." Indeed, throughout Luke–Acts, and especially in Acts, Peter emerges as the lead apostle in the early church "catching men" to follow Christ. Luke reports that Peter was bringing in literally "thousands" of believers into the Church (see, for example, Acts 2:41).

Writing about twenty years after the martyrdom of Peter around the year AD 85, Luke bore witness to a growing church rooted in Jerusalem and expanding all the way west to Rome. The miraculous catch of fish associated with the call and commission of Simon Peter in today's reading served as a metaphor for the impact that Peter would have as an apostle of Christ and as an evangelizer for the good news—as Peter ventured "into deep water" he caught such "a great number of fish" that "their nets were tearing."

In his First Letter to the Corinthians, Paul preserves a "received" tradition about the Resurrection appearances of Christ. Dated to the spring of AD 55, First Corinthians offers us the earliest attestation of witnesses to Jesus' resurrection. First among those listed as witnesses to the resurrected Christ is Cephas (Peter). ("Cephas" is the Aramaic name for Peter and it translates literally as "a rock." Aramaic was the native language of Jesus and Peter.) Since First Corinthians was written only about twenty years after the death and resurrection of Jesus, it is reasonable to conclude that from the very beginning, Peter was recognized as having a prominent place in Jesus' life and in the life of the early church.

The first reading recounts the call of the prophet Isaiah. The call of Isaiah is dated to the year 742 BC, the year in which historians date the death of King Uzziah. Isaiah reports a view of the unseen order as part of his call, as well as his own fear and anxiety and shortcomings. Like Peter, Isaiah reacts to the call with humility and eagerness. In this way, all Christians see in Peter and Isaiah a model response to the call of Christ.

#### **Tim's Tidbits**

Last week I mentioned Catholic Schools Week, which concluded on February 6. Did you know that if you attend a Catholic School there is financial assistance available? The *Stewards for Tomorrow* endowment fund is available. For over 15 years, *Stewards for Tomorrow* funds have made Catholic education more affordable. Since 1995, more than 55,000 tuition grants have been issued. Of a total current enrollment of 32,000 students in Catholic schools in southeast Michigan, 2,562 students – more than 12 percent – are receiving tuition assistance. To apply, contact the administrative office of any Catholic school in the Archdiocese of Detroit, or access forms and details on the archdiocesan website. The process is similar to applying for college financial aid.

A letter from *Alliance Catholic Credit Union* went out recently announcing their 2016 Scholarship Program. The philanthropic program gives away \$10,000 annually to help students and families defray educational costs. For a complete list of eligibility requirements and to obtain an application packet, please visit their website at AllianceCCU.com/Scholarship. Applications are due by April 18, 2016. This is the last Sunday before we begin the season of Lent. It is the last weekend you will hear "Alleluias" sung – we won't be

hearing them until the Great Easter Vigil. We begin Ash Wednesday this week. Two items to note on our parish calendar are the Soup Suppers. The first one is on Thursday, February 25 from 5:30 to 6:45. It is followed by Mass with Fr. Stephen Rooney presiding. Fr. Rooney will offer an

extended Homily about the spirituality of St. Therese of Liseaux. He earned a Licentiate in Rome in Spirituality. His dissertation topic was what he will talk about. Fr. Stephen has served at a number of parishes in the Archdiocese. His recent Pastorates include St. Michael in Monroe, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel in Temperance and his current assignment of Our Lady on the River in Marine City. Father incardinated into the Archdiocese from the Cistercian Community in Ireland, his native home. He was ordained in 1985 and can speak four languages. He has been in the US since 1986 and became a citizen a few years ago.

The second will be on Thursday, March 10th, from 5:30 to 6:45. It is followed by Mass with Fr. Richard Leliaert, presiding. Fr. Richard will offer an extended Homily on "Covenant". He has a PhD from Berkley, CA in American Religious History and has served on the faculty of Nazareth College in Kalamazoo, Director of Spiritual Support Services at Oakwood Hospital in Dearborn and more recently, as Pastor of St. Robert Bellarmine Parish in Redford. Father incardinated into the Archdiocese of Detroit from the Crosier Community. He was ordained in 1967. He speaks Spanish fluently.

We invite parishioners and friends to attend these Lenten events. For the soup suppers, I invite you to consider bringing in a crock pot of your favorite recipe of soup to share with our community. 
Future Movie Night suggestions and dates will be determined. Watch for notices here in the Voice.

#### LENTEN OBSERVANCES

Lent is the season which runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of total fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. In keeping with the spirit and meaning of the Lenten fast, Catholics are encouraged to observe the Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday and until the celebration of the Easter Vigil.

The <u>law of fasting</u> binds persons from the completing of their 18th year to the beginning of their 60th year, i.e., from the day after their 18th birthday to the day after their 59th birthday.

The <u>law of fasting</u> allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing - as far as quantity and quality are concerned - approved local custom. The order of meals is optional; i.e., the full meal may be taken in the evening instead of midday. Also: (1) the quantity of food taken at the two lighter meals should not exceed the quantity taken at the full meal. (2) The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast.

The law of abstinence binds persons from the completion of their 14th year - i.e. from the day after their 14th birthday throughout life.

The law of abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, the products of milk or condiments made of animal fat. Permissible are soup flavored with meat, meat gravy and sauces.

St. Peter Chrysologus (380-450) states in his "Sermon 43" that "Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting . . . they cannot be separated. If you have only one of them or not at all together, you have nothing. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others, you open God's ear to yourself. . . . Fasting bears no fruit unless it is watered by mercy. Fasting dries up when mercy dries up. Mercy is to fasting as rain to the earth. However much you cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices, show virtues, if you do not release the springs of mercy, your fasting will bear no fruit. When you fast, if your mercy is thin your harvest will be thin; when you fast, what you pour out in mercy overflows into your barn. Therefore, do not lose by saving, but gathering by scattering. Give to the poor, and you give to yourself. You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others."



Lent provides us with time to reflect on the temptations we face and remember we rely on God for all things. Through our participation in Operation Rice Bowl, we put our faith into actions and our prayers and alms help people in need around the world. Please take home a Calendar and Rice Bowl for your family and follow the suggested activities during Lent. These supplies are available on the table at the entrance of the church.


