

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

March 13, 2016

Before I go further to share my musings, let me reiterate what I have said before regarding Nigeria. Nigeria is by no means a poor country when you put her side by side to other third world nations. In fact, Nigeria is the richest country in the continent of Africa. She is strangulated not by poverty but by corruption. The wealth of Nigeria is concentrated in the hands of a few in power, leaving the masses to live in abject poverty. Even in a democracy, one does not dare to speak truth to power; otherwise, one will face a violent fate. For this reason, the masses are suffering in silence.


The events that took place while I was in Nigeria, as far as my mission, were exhausting and exciting. Last week I narrated a series of interventions that came about due to your financial support. While the medical mission was the main focus, we conducted assistance with the Soup Kitchen. From the time of my arrival to departure, warm meals were served to those who had not eaten in days and those who had not eaten any nutritious meals for a long time. There was a make-shift kitchen that served this purpose since the inception of this mission. Although, the kitchen was not in the best structure due to age and lack of maintenance, it was spruced up and cleaned out ready for the crowd. We served food for four days each week and offered uncooked food to large families who couldn't eat at the Soup Kitchen for the sake of shame, and those who wanted to have enough to save for another meal. I noticed that some parents would send their children to bring back food for the family because of shame of being labelled lazy and jobless. While we noticed what was going on, we served anyone who came to the Kitchen. The favorite and predominant foods in Nigeria are rice, beans and a native food; garri. Garri is a byproduct of Cassava. Before inflation, it used to be inexpensive and everybody could afford it, but these days, the inflation rate has made every commodity in Nigeria out of the reach of the ordinary person. Rice and beans on the other hand, while it has been the food of the well-to-do, with inflation, it has continued to be extremely expensive. The poor eat it once in a great while, especially on occasions such as birthdays, anniversaries, Christmas and Easter. Those who eat rice and beans often are considered well off. Perhaps you can appreciate why people come to the Soup Kitchen for some of these delicatessens.

During this trip, I visited some elementary schools where I observed with dismay the condition of a lot of schools. Most schools are government owned. Like the hospitals that I reported about last week, the state of the school system in Nigeria is dismal. Some of the classrooms are infested with rodents and roaches, and many do not have doors. There are no school supplies of any kind. It is strictly up to the parents of the students to provide for the education of their children. Teachers who complain about lack of salary barely come to school, and when they do, they depend on the students to provide teacher's aide. The laissez-faire attitude of teachers is evident in the truancy and tardiness of students. As you walk into any of the classrooms, one cannot but notice uneven floors, walls with structural damage, students sitting on the floor, and some without writing materials like pens and books. School uniforms become dingy in a matter of days of first being washed because of dust and dirt.

With your assistance, I provided one school with twenty desks, paid for the flooring of the two classrooms and bought school supplies for one classroom. My visit was so unannounced that it surprised teachers and the principal of the one school. Because of this gesture, the Principal gathered the students and teachers to thank me by singing the Nigerian National anthem, and asked me to pray for Nigeria and its leaders. In return, I told them that the gesture was made possible in part by the good people of my parish in the United States.







While I am still on the subject of schools, I visited a Catholic University whose facility was a lot better than most government schools but not without its own challenges. There was a visible difference on the façade of the campus. The grass was manicured; bushes and trees trimmed, but the external optics did not reflect the internal experience. School tuition by the Nigerian standard was expensive and most parents could not afford it. A lot of promising students were sent home for tuition delinquency. Teachers in this Catholic University complained they had not been paid their salaries for five months because students had not paid their tuition. Again, because of limited resources, I offered to pay tuition for five students. These students were selected as the president of the school shared stories of struggling parents who want the best for their children. More stories to come!
