PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

March 20, 2016

Continuing the reflection on my Nigerian trip, I am writing you today about a specific event, among many others, that I was completely unprepared for. On this day, I went to visit a niece of mine in college who could not come to see me because she was writing her exams. It was a very hot scorching day, about 94 degrees; I was sweating profusely as most people were looking for shelter due to the intense heat. The distance to my niece's college was about 80 miles. So, I set out to visit her with the hope of getting back to other schedules. My niece's college was about four miles to a hospital run by the state. As I approached the school, the entrance was blocked because of some construction on the road median. Because of this, I had to make a detour in order to enter the school. In less than a mile, I saw a young lady who was by the roadside, pregnant and bleeding. I also observed that there were people who walked by her side and totally ignored her. There were those who saw her but kept a distance because they were afraid she might die.

So, I pulled over and went to her and asked what was going on. She was weak and could barely speak. I heard her say that she went to the hospital and was turned away by the hospital administration because she could not afford a deposit for hospitalization. I motioned to some of the passersby to assist me in getting her to the vehicle, some responded while others were moping at us. At this time, she was helpless and almost unresponsive. I made a U-turn to the hospital and asked that she be attended to. Funny enough, the hospital staff and nurses recognized her immediately because she was there earlier. One of them asked me, "Are you the husband?" One of them assumed I was. She said, "How could you send your wife to the hospital alone in her condition without money for her admission?" Then, the matron of the hospital spoke to me in a harsh voice, "Oga (Sir), take your wife to another hospital because we do not work for charity." It was at this moment that I explained to them I was a priest, that I found this woman on the side of the road and brought her to be given medical attention. They were all surprised, and felt bad because of their erroneous assumptions. But still the matron insisted that I had to put down a deposit before they could commence treatment. I gave what I had with me at the time to the hospital and had to return to my home to get money to complete the fee. On trust that I was a priest, and that I had deposited some money, they took her to the Neonatal Unit. So, I called my niece to give me a rain check, that something very urgent and pressing had surfaced. Obviously, she was disappointed but understood.



MONTHLY UPDATE FROM ST. ALEXANDER'S FOOD PANTRY

While we all recognize that we have been blessed this winter with relatively mild weather, we also continue to count our blessings for the stocked shelves that we are seeing in our Food Pantry during the winter months this year. Donations of groceries as well as monetary donations have remained steady during a time of the year that normally drops off after the holidays, so we feel most fortunate to be able to offer many choices to our client families. This year, the Gleaners delivery truck stops by once a month to offer us fresh produce, so thus far, we have been able to provide potatoes, apples, onions, broccoli, carrots and grapefruit to our families.

The recertification process continued during the month of February, and thus far, more than 130 families have completed the screening and have qualified for food assistance every four weeks from our outreach program.



Remember, the trip was about 80 miles one way. I went home and returned to the hospital. Upon my return, I was told that the young lady had lost a lot of blood and would need blood. The problem was that the hospital had no blood bank and would require a purchase of blood or donation of blood. The place was unfamiliar to me, and the closest hospital to the one we were at was about another 30 miles away and there was no guarantee that it would have blood. I pleaded with my niece to consider donating blood and she agreed. First, they checked to make sure she was a candidate for blood donation. By this time, it was getting dark and I needed to return home. I gave my name, number and address to the hospital should they need to contact me, and promised to return the next day. So, very early the next morning in the company of one of my nephews and a friend, we went to the hospital. On reaching there, we were told that they performed a caesarian section on her because the child was in distress.

While we were there, one who claimed to be the husband of the lady showed up. He looked semi-challenged mentally, and unaware of the trauma his wife went through. He was pacing the lobby and could not connect with the questions he was being asked. He seemed totally disconnected from reality. His physical appearance suggested his state of being. I knew he was not able to pay his wife's hospital bill. We asked to see the young lady and her child and were denied because she was still in pain. However, we were told that she did not know how she ended up in the hospital, and when she was told that we made it possible for her to be admitted she cried and wanted to see me. Later that day, I returned to see her and the baby and tears could not stop flowing from my eyes.

Often we say that God works in mysterious ways, this is an example of that. Consider the events that brought me to this woman. If there was no construction at the entrance of my niece's school, I would not have seen this lady by the road side. My niece also played a role by donating blood to save her. The parishioners of St Gerald, a world away, through their financial and prayerful support became her angel too. But then, imagine my joy! This is why I love doing the things I do on my vacation – to see someone smile. Have a Blessed Holy Week! Fr. Festus
