THE MOST HOLY TRINITY MAY 22, 2016

The Christian faith is a religion of love to a far greater degree than it is a religion of law. The laws of God are important, but they are a matter of rules and regulations. In a religion of love, God's initiative is an expression of the truest love of all. In fact, God's love is given to us to help us keep the divine laws. God does not withhold love from us until we obey God's laws.

First reading – Proverbs 8:22-31

In this passage from the book of Proverbs wisdom is personified as God's first creation. Before the heavens and the earth were even created, the Creator brought forth wisdom. One thing this means is that God's wisdom, God's truth, must always be the world's greatest good and highest goal.

Second reading - Romans 5:1-5

The Christian faith places a great deal of emphasis on hope. Although we look to the past for guidance, we look to the future for fulfillment. We have not yet seen or heard everything that God has in store for us. There is far more to God's truth than has been revealed to us at any given time.

Gospel – John 16:12-15

Even by the testimony of his enemies, Jesus was a remarkable, matchless teacher. But he did not complete the work of teaching all of God's truth during his lifetime on this earth. Jesus did, however, promise to send his Holy Spirit. The Spirit is present in us and with us to guide us in the discovery of new truth and deeper wisdom.

The word "Trinity" does not appear in the Bible. It comes from the third century, and the classical formulation of the doctrine comes from the fourth century. Throughout the Bible the multifaceted nature of God is revealed. The language of Father, Son and Holy Spirit is found throughout the New Testament. The doctrines of the church are best seen as attempts to express the experiences of the people of faith. The Trinity is a way of expressing and interpreting the Christian experience of God. It was the first Christians' experiences of God, of Jesus, and of the Holy Spirit that made the doctrine of the Trinity necessary.

The primary message of the Trinity is that God can be trusted. The Trinity represents the integrity of God. The three aspects of God are not at odds with each other. What God does is consistent with what God has done and will do! There is no inconsistency in God's actions or manifestations. We can trust God's integrity. The challenge for us is to never stop growing. Learning is a long journey. We will never run out of things to learn. The more we know, the more we don't know. The more we learn, the more we need to learn. The increase of knowledge means the increase of mystery. What if the disciples had stopped learning when Jesus died? For one thing, Simon Peter would have remained an arrogant racist! No human metaphor is adequate to describe the full mystery of God. God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. God is shepherd, king, priest, wonderful counselor, eternal God, everlasting Father, Prince of Peace, the alpha and the omega, the bright and morning star. But we must keep seeking and growing. The human knowledge of God is inexhaustible. But, finally the most important thing to learn is that God is love.
