The readings for the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time are a continuation of the readings from last Sunday. On both Sundays, we hear about God's judgment toward those who are self-centered and self-indulgent at the expense of others.

The first reading is taken again from the Book of Amos. One of the hallmarks of the two-hundred-year period of the divided kingdom (922–721 BC) was the rise of the prophets. The northern kingdom of Israel saw Hosea and Amos. Isaiah and Micah were prophets active in the southern kingdom of Judah. These prophets emerged and spoke of God's displeasure with his chosen people who too often ignored the Mosaic law that defined them historically and culturally, and who were unfaithful to the terms of the covenantal promises God established with their ancestors.

In the first reading, Amos speaks of the rich being "the first to go into exile." Scholars date this prophecy to around 750 BC, just a few decades before being fulfilled as the Assyrian Empire was on the verge of capturing and destroying the northern kingdom of Israel in 721 BC. Many of the Old Testament prophets saw the political and military fortunes of Israel and her neighbors as controlled by God. The abuse and complacency of the social and political elites toward the poor and unclean of Amos' time went a long way, in his view, toward explaining Israel's defeat and exile at the hands of the Assyrians. The leaders of Israel indulged in the luxuries of life while oblivious to the impending threat about to consume them as a people: "Lying upon beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches, they eat lambs taken from the flock, and calves from the stall!" Amos prophesied that God would hold them accountable for such behavior.

The Gospel reading is once again a parable unique to the Gospel of Luke. The parable of the rich man and Lazarus develops the idea of God's judgment upon the rich who exploited the poor. Luke likely preserved this parable because it develops further one of his favorite motifs, that of the great reversal. It is not by accident that Jesus directs this parable to the Pharisees. The rich man's self-centered perspective and desire to be separated from the unclean resembles much of what Jesus criticized in the Pharisees. The contrast between this rich man and Lazarus in both clothing and food is extreme but typical for Jesus' day. Many of the social elites had gates surrounding their homes so that the unclean and extremely poor people would be kept at a safe distance. And the rich man's refusal to share table fellowship with Lazarus is in sharp contrast with Jesus' table fellowship with the poor and marginalized. For Luke, the parable captures well the great divine reversal that would be experienced in the age to come.

The second reading from 1 Timothy is some of Paul's final words to his beloved coworker Timothy. In this deutero-Pauline letter, the apostle Paul is portrayed as offering advice for Timothy. It is advice the author hopes all leaders of Christian communities will follow. He begins by listing various virtues to cultivate as a leader in the community: righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. The author then "charges" Timothy: "Compete well for the faith." It is a charge that Jesus and Amos make to their audiences as well. Competing well for the faith is not so much about winning the contest as it is about offering mercy and forgiveness to self and other.



#### **Tim's Tidbits**

"But you, people of God, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience and gentleness."

In today's second reading, Paul's letter to Timothy encourages him to be faithful to the commandment of God until the return of Jesus Christ. Paul would know and expect that his letter would be read to the local gathering of believers and so the phrase "I charge you" could apply to those who listen to the reading of his letter as well as to Timothy. In this vein, the words of Paul's letter are addressed also to us today. (Sourcebook, 2016)
