The readings for the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time address some of the characteristics of faith necessary for the life of the believer. Chief among these are patience, humility, and courage.

The first reading contains the opening words from the Book of Habakkuk. This prophetic text begins with Habakkuk complaining to the Lord about the violence and misery he sees all around. Active in the southern kingdom of Judea around the year 600 BC (in the years leading into Israel's deportation and exile to Babylon), Habakkuk cried out to God for divine justice. God's response to Habakkuk amounted to his prophetic call and commission: "Write down the vision clearly upon the tablets, so that one can read it readily." (The vision contains God's judgement against those who oppressed and mistreated his people). But before God conveys the vision to Habakkuk, he challenges the prophet to be patient in anticipation of the vision's fulfillment. Patience with God and trust in God's word are marks of faith that define the life of the "just one."

In the Gospel reading, the apostles make a seemingly simple request of Jesus: "Increase our faith." Jesus offers a twofold response—both a pithy proverb as well as a more measured saying. His initial reply to the apostles is a comment on the power of faith: even a tiny amount of authentic faith ("a mustard seed") renders amazing results. But then Jesus offers another perspective to consider when making the request to "increase our faith." Drawing upon the servant-master relationship—one in which the apostles would be very familiar—Jesus speaks about role expectations between the servant and the master. And Jesus' message is clear: the master (God) has demands that require an obligation and commitment from his servants (disciples). For the apostles to increase their faith, they must begin by exercising an attitude of humility. By a humble submission of their will to God, the apostles (and disciples of all ages) will increase their faith.

Over the next four Sundays, the second reading is taken from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy. This letter, along with 1 Timothy and Titus, are commonly grouped together under the title of the Pastoral Letters. Most scholars are convinced that these letters should be classified as deutero-Pauline letters; that is, letters written in Paul's name and with his authority by the next generation of Pauline Christians. The pastorals are commonly dated to around the year AD 100, and the actual author is unknown. One of the characteristics of the pastorals is the way in which they offer Paul as a model of an ideal church leader. Today's reading captures this well. As a church leader who imparts "the gift of God" by the "imposition of [his] hands," the author encourages believers to have the same "power and love and self-control" as that of the beloved Paul. Rather than be ashamed of the faith when faced with the "hardship" that comes from preaching and living the good news of Jesus Christ, the author exhorts his audience to have the courage and commitment exhibited by Paul. For believers a generation removed from the historical Paul, his words have become "the norm" in the faith and love in Christ Jesus.

It is interesting to note that within a generation after Paul's death around AD 64, followers of Christ viewed the Pauline tradition as a "rich trust" to be guarded by the community. Paul quickly became an icon of the faith for his courage to preach the Gospel. *Dr. Daniel J. Scholz*
