

The readings for the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time revolve around the theme of persistence. In many matters concerning our faith, we are challenged as disciples of Christ to have tenacity and perseverance.

The first reading from the Book of Exodus recounts one of the early battles Moses and the Israelites faced with opposing forces. As they travelled through the unwelcomed territories of the various desert regions on their way to the Promised Land, Moses and his army (under the command of Joshua) were over 600,000 men strong. They would have been perceived as a grave threat to the people living in and near the regions through which they were passing. The Amalekites were one such people who choose to wage war against Israel rather than allow them to freely pass. We hear in today's reading how God was present with Moses and the Israelites in battle only for as long as Moses could keep the staff in his hands raised. With the help of his brother Aaron and his assistant, Hur, together they were able to support Moses, lifting his staff above the battlefield. While Moses' hands were held high and his staff was raised, Joshua and his army "mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword." God expected the Israelites to work together and remain committed to each other throughout their forty-year trek in the wilderness.

In the second reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy, we hear the author once again present Paul as the model for church leadership: "Remain faithful to what you have learned and believed, because you know from whom you learned it [Paul]." Within a generation after Paul's death (around AD 100 at the writing of Second Timothy), Paul's status among Christians was already revered.

The author then offers some insight into Scripture and sound advice to his audience in the name of Paul. First, he speaks of the power of Scripture: it "is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness." Second, he gives a "charge" to the community leaders to whom he writes: "proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient." He further adds, "Convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching." For the author of Second Timothy, leadership within these early Christian communities requires consistency in modeling the faith to the believers within their congregations.

The Gospel reading is the parable of the persistent widow. This parable is unique to the third Gospel. Luke likely preserved this parable because it conflates two of his favorite topics: prayer and widows. Throughout Luke–Acts, for example, Luke presents prayer as an essential component in the life of believers—ranging from the prayers of Mary and Zechariah in the infancy narrative (the canticle of Mary, Luke 1:46-55, and the canticle of Zechariah, Luke 1:67-79) to the community of believers gathered in Jerusalem after Jesus' ascension in the earliest stages of the Church (Acts 2:42-47; 4:23-35). Luke also consistently presents Jesus' concern for widows: Jesus raises the widow's son from the dead (7:11-17), decries scribes who take advantage of widows (20:45-47), and holds up widows as models of faith because they generously give to others in need (21:1-4). In today's parable, Jesus teaches the disciples that God responds "speedily" to those who pray with fervor and constancy.

Today's second reading from the second letter of Paul to Timothy, we hear Paul continue to instruct and encourage Timothy in preaching the Word of God. Paul understood that Jesus came to fulfill the Scriptures and that persistence in proclaiming the Word of God was his primary responsibility. He urges Timothy to make it his as well. 
