RITE OF RECONCILIATION Saturdays: 3:30 – 4:30 p.m. The solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, is the last Sunday in ordinary time and marks the conclusion of another liturgical year. This final solemnity acknowledges that believers worldwide affirm that Christ alone reigns supreme in our universe and in our church.

The first reading is taken from the Second Book of Samuel, a title created in honor of the prophet Samuel, Israel's last judge from the period of the Judges, 1200–1020 BC. (This was the time when the Israelites were ruled regionally by tribal judges, covering roughly two hundred years between the Israelites arrival in the Promised Land to the establishment of a monarchy.) In today's reading we hear about the transition between the first two kings of Israel's Monarchy period, Saul and David. The monarchy lasted nearly one hundred years, 1020–922 BC. David ascended to the throne of the United Monarchy around the year 1000 BC. While Saul's reign over the monarchy was filled with the typical turbulence of a transition in governance from regional judges to a single king, under King David, Israel for the first time in their history had a single king that united and guided the people of Israel. The monarchy was a form of government that the people of Israel had wanted for themselves, despite the warnings of the judge and prophet Samuel (see 1 Sm 8).

In the reading today we hear of the people's anointing of David as King of Israel, succeeding Saul. In 2 Samuel 5:1-5 (we hear only verses 1-3 of 2 Sm 5 in this reading) we also learn that David was thirty years old when he was anointed King of Israel, and he reigned as Israel's king for thirty-three years. With David, God established the Davidic Covenant (see 2 Sm 7:8-17), the promise that David's house and kingdom would last forever, and the promise of an heir who would "build a house for my name" (2 Sm 7:13). Long after the monarchy was gone, many Israelites looked back at the reign of King David as Israel's golden years. The earliest Christians came to believe that Jesus was the fulfillment of the covenant that God had established with King David. This is why we hear Jesus referred to as "Son of David" often in the Gospels (see, for example, Mk 10:46-52).

Today's Gospel reading is Luke's account of Jesus' agonizing death on the cross. We hear how Jesus was taunted while suffering on the cross. The Jewish rulers and Roman soldiers jeered and mocked Jesus calling him, "King of the Jews." The idea of anyone claiming the political title of "king" was a particularly sensitive and dangerous idea in the days of the Roman Empire when Caesar alone was professed as the King of the Empire. The perception of Jesus claiming the title of "king" was rooted in the centerpiece of his public ministry—"the kingdom of God." Certainly many of Jesus' followers believed he was their long awaited Messiah and King who would restore the golden age of Israel's Monarchy.

The second reading is taken from Paul's Letter to the Colossians. It contains one of the earliest Christological hymns in the New Testament (Col 1:15-20). Most scholars believe Paul inherited this hymn and embedded it into his letter. Paul inserts this hymn into his Letter to the Colossians as a way of connecting with this community in their common belief in the supremacy of Jesus as King of the universe. This hymn reinforces the remarkable irony of those mocking Jesus on the cross as "King of the Jews." Dating back to the original generation of believers, this hymn unites believers in all ages in our firm conviction that Jesus Christ alone reigns supreme.




