

CHRISTIAN SERVICE



WORSHIP



At St. Gerald's we have lectors, those who proclaim God's word at Liturgy; Eucharistic Ministers, those who distribute the Eucharist to folks during Liturgy; Ushers and Greeters, who assist and greet people attending the Liturgy. Sacristans are usually behind the scenes preparing the vessels, bread and wine. Altar Servers, who assist the priest. Church cleaners,

who keep God's house tidy. Altar linen washers, who wash and iron the various towels and linens for the Liturgy.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT:

Amidst the beautiful readings at the Christmas Masses is a reading from a small New Testament letter from Saint Paul to his protégé, Titus, read at Midnight Mass. Saint Paul reminds Titus that God has given us a gift in the person of Jesus Christ. This gift represents God's active presence in our lives and in our world. This gift redeems us from evil and death.

This gift purifies us as God's people. This is a gift that also comes with an expectation: that we receive it with thanksgiving, allow it to transform us into Christ's image; and from it, learn how to live a life "eager to do what is good." Take time the next few days to reflect on the marvelous gift we celebrate at Christmas, and how we might become better stewards of this gift.





The song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is an English Christmas carol. From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the Church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember. To fit the number scheme, when you reach number 9, representing the Fruits of the Holy Ghost, the originator combined 6 to make 3, taking the 6 fruits that were similar: the fruit in each parenthesis is the that was not named separately. There are actually Twelve Fruits of the Holy Ghost.

The "True Love" one hears in the song is not a smitten boy or girlfriend but Jesus Christ, because truly Love was born on Christmas Day. The partridge in the pear tree also represents Him because that bird is willing to sacrifice its life if necessary to protect its young by feigning injury to draw away predators.

According to Ann Ball in her book, HANDBOOK OF CATHOLIC SACRAMENTALS:

The two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments

The three French hens stood for faith, hope, and love.

The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The five golden rings rerepresented the first five books of the Old Testament, which describe man's fall into sin and the great love of God in sending a Savior.

The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.

Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit-----Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit-----Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience [Forbearance], Goodness [Kindness], Mildness, Fidelity, Modesty, Continency [Chastity].

The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.

The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful Apostles.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in The Apostles' Creed.

Afternoon we arrive in Czestochowa. Short tour of Jasna Gora. Overnight in Czestochowa./**B.L.**/

DAY 5 May 14 Sunday CZESTOCHOWA - ZAKOPANE

Holy Mass at the Virgin Mary Shrine housing the icon of Black Madonna, Jasna Góra's most precious treasure to which miraculous powers are attributed. Founded in 1382 by Pauline monks from Hungary. From here we continue to Zakopane. Enjoyable evening drive-through sightseeing of breath-taking Zakopane. Overnight in Zakopane./**B.L.**/

DAY 6 May 15 Monday ZAKOPANE

Today we explore Zakopane. Beautifully situated at the foot of the Tatra Mountains, in the valley between Gubalowka and Giewont. It is the most popular resort and one of the most beautiful places in all of Poland. You will have a chance to admire Zakopane from the top of the Gubalowka mountain. Afternoon we continue our excursion to Morskie Oko, the largest and most majestic lake in Tatras. Dinner with folkloric show at one of Highlander's famous restaurant. 


Knights Did a Lot of Giving This Year to Parish and to Others With Your Help

May the Blessings of Christmas be upon the families of St. Gerald's Knights. During 2016 the Knights again have proven faithful to one of the attributes of their order: charity, Some of giving in 2016 included these projects:

- * Provided more than 2,000 pounds of food and paper * products to the St. Al and St. Gerald pantries through the Council's Red Bag program and a neighborhood food drive.
- * Gave \$1,000 to the Parish St Vincent de Paul Society to * support its aid to the poor.
- * Donated \$300 to Rebuilding Together of Oakland County.
- * Cooked two pancake breakfasts for the parish, one of them producing net proceeds of \$1,000 toward a memorial for Msgr. Ed Baldwin at St. Anne Mead Center.
- * Purchased two sets of pads for the parish's AED machines, emergency devices used in the case of a heart attack.
- * Sponsored 5 bus trips for parishioners to the FireKeepers Casino near Battle Creek.
- * Manned the grills at the Parish Picnic plus leading the setup and tear down crews. Other Knights and spouses helped with other picnic chores.
- * Helped the Vacation Bible School with a \$300 donation.
- * Provided the manpower to revamp the Church sound system * and extend it to the Social Hall.

- Joined with six other K of C Councils in providing manpower and funds to a major remodeling project at a Farmington Hills cloistered nuns facility.
