TIM'S TIDBITS

February is Catholic Press Month. It's been named such for a number of years now. The president of the Catholic Press Association of the United States and Canada, Greg Erlandson, wrote this, "It is critical that Catholics not only have access to sound news coverage and commentary, but that they hear directly from their leaders on the issues of the day and have the resources to see their world through the eyes of faith. Only the Catholic press gives Catholic leaders a voice with which to be heard by their people - unmuted, uncensored and independent of the preconceptions and prejudices of too many secular media outlets."

What Catholic Press do you subscribe to? For a few years now, I like to subscribe to another Diocesan newspaper. I used to subscribe to the Catholic New World, from the Archdiocese of Chicago. It has a new name now, Chicago Catholic. Now, I subscribe to, The Pilot, from the Archdiocese of Boston. I also read, The Michigan Catholic, of course. Many diocesan papers are online as well. Several other Catholic magazines and newspaper include America, the Jesuit Review, Commonweal, US Catholic and the National Catholic Reporter. On a daily basis, I try to read all of these or their articles online. It's important to keep abreast of our Catholic leaders and our Holy Father. And in light of recent events, reading the wonderful teachings and speeches by our beloved Holy Father is important.

An important TV station is, Catholic TV. They are out of the Archdiocese of Boston and have partnered locally with our Catholic Television Network of Detroit (CTND). Catholic TV is America's Catholic Television Network. Their mission statement reads as follows: "Catholic TV is a beacon of Hope and a unique Herald of the simple, yet profound Message of Jesus Christ, Who is made truly present among us in the Breaking of the Bread. Utilizing powerful technology, we strive to connect People of Faith. Through relevant, inspiring and prayerful programming we educate, teaching the Wisdom of God in the Catholic Tradition, endeavoring to move people of all ages, cultures and attitudes toward the Fullness of Life."

Have you seen the new movie, Silence? It's about the early Jesuit mission to Japan. It's well done. I saw it the first weekend it came out in Michigan. A brief synopsis from the website states: "Martin Scorsese's SILENCE tells the story of two Christian missionaries (Andrew Garfield and Adam Driver) who face the ultimate test of faith when they travel to Japan in search of their missing mentor (Liam Neeson) — at a time when Christianity was outlawed and their presence forbidden. The celebrated director's 28-year journey to bring Shusaku Endo's 1966 acclaimed novel to life will be in theaters this Christmas." The star, Andrew Garfield, prepared for his role by making the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius with Fr. James Martin, SJ. It is a long movie, but worth seeing.

By the way, there is a Detroit connection to this movie. One of the movie's executive producers is Matthew Malek. He attended the University of Detroit Jesuit High School and was a student at Sacred Heart Major Seminary for awhile. His story in the Detroit Free Press quotes, "When Matthew Malek was a young Detroit seminary student flying to Rome in the early 2000s to attend pontifical college, he took a book to read on the plane that was recommended by his rector, who is now Detroit's Archbishop Allen Vigneron. "I told Archbishop Vigneron I wanted to read every important Catholic novel of the 20th Century, and this was the one I hadn't read," says the metro Detroit native. The book was "Silence," a 1966 novel by Shusaku Endo."





Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper Good Opportunity to Sell State Charity Raffle Tickets

Brother Tom Seabolt, chairman of the Committee researching involvement in the State of Michigan's Millionaire Charitable Party program, reported on the progress of our license application at last Tuesday's Officers meeting. He said we have been assigned a tracking number and are an estimated 8 to 12 weeks away from a review. Still in the works is a decision whether our Council has enough manpower to successfully work a party three or four times a year.

PGK Bruce Roberts reports he is getting a good response to his attempts to sell State K of C Charity raffle tickets. Bruce is coordinating ticket sales for the Council. The raffle has four great major prizes plus 26 cash prizes ranging from \$1,000 to \$150. The major prizes also include cash. The first prize is a 7 day Alaskan cruise for 2 includes air fare and \$5,000 in spending money; the second place award of a week for 2 at Atlantis Paradise Island includes \$3,000 cash; the third place prize of a week at a Cancun resort includes \$1,000 cash, and the fourth place prizes offers \$500 cash and a guided tour during a three night stay for two in Washington D.C. If you need more tickets to sell, contact him at 248-756-9257. The drawing will be April 22 at 2:30 PM at DeCarlo's Banquet Center in Warren. If you still have unsold tickets, also contact Bruce.
