



### TIM'S TIDBITS

In the bookrack in the gathering space of the church, I have placed copies of the Focus brochure from the Michigan Catholic Conference entitled, "*Promoting a Respect for Life*." As we remember the events in 1973, the Mass celebrated on January 22, is called, "For Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life", as found in the Ordo; that is the official pastoral guide for the liturgical cycle of the Church Year. And we remember that <u>all</u> human life is sacred. We are called to keep in prayer all of the human family.

In the article is a quote from the late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, of the Archdiocese of Chicago:

Joseph Cardinal Bernardin of Chicago coined the term "consistent etic of life" in describing the Catholic Church's prolife position during a 1983 lecture at Fordham University. Cardinal Bernardin emphasized that every life is sacred, and that "The taking of even one human life is a momentous event." A consistent ethic of life means preserving and enhancing life every step of the way. As part of this mentality, Catholics are encouraged to pray for the unborn, to promote adoption and alternatives to abortion, to call for end-of-life care that truly respects each patient, and to stand against the threats that plague American society such as assisted suicide, the death penalty, embryonic stem cell research and gun violence.

I encourage you to pick up a copy and read the pages.



As you may know, we have had a Mass of Anointing scheduled for the First Saturdays of each month. Beginning this month, January, we will offer the Mass of Anointing quarterly. We had one already on January 6. The following will be on April 7, July 7 and October 6. The time would remain the same, at 9:15 AM.

The following comes from the General Introduction on the Pastoral Care of the Sick, article 8-15, paraphrased:

The Letter of James states that the sick are to be anointed in order to raise them up and save them. Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this sacrament.

The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious.

A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.

Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. Sick children are to be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament. In case of doubt whether a child has reached the use of reason, the sacrament is to be conferred.

In public and private catechesis, the faithful should be educated to ask for the sacrament of anointing and, as soon as the right time comes, to receive it with full faith and devotion. They should not follow the wrongful practice of delaying the reception of the sacrament.

The sacrament of anointing is to be conferred on sick people who, although they have lost consciousness or the use of reason, would, as Christian believers, have at least implicitly asked for it when they were in control of their faculties.

When a priest has been called to attend those who are already dead, he should not administer the sacrament of anointing. Instead, he should pray for them, asking that God forgive their sins and graciously receive them into the kingdom.

This is a means of education for all, so that we are aware of when to call a priest and to know more about the Sacrament of Anointing. May God's blessings be upon each of us this week.


#### STEWARDSHIP MOMENT


