



He provides an example of the believer testifying to Christ's power.



#### LENTEN OBSERVANCES

Lent is the season which runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of total fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. In keeping with the spirit and meaning of the Lenten fast, Catholics are encouraged to observe the Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday and until the celebration of the Easter Vigil.

The <u>law of fasting</u> binds persons from the completing of their 18th year to the beginning of their 60th year, i.e., from the day after their 18th birthday to the day after their 59th birthday.

The <u>law of fasting</u> allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing - as far as quantity and quality are concerned - approved local custom. The order of meals is optional; i.e., the full meal may be taken in the evening instead of midday. Also: (1) the quantity of food taken at the two lighter meals should not exceed the quantity taken at the full meal. (2)The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast.

The <u>law of abstinence</u> binds persons from the completion of their 14th year - i.e. from the day after their 14th birthday throughout life.

The law of abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, the products of milk or condiments made of animal fat. Permissible are soup flavored with meat, meat gravy and sauces.

St. Peter Chrysologus (380-450) states in his "Sermon 43" that "Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting ... they cannot be separated. If you have only one of them or not at all together, you have nothing. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others, you open God's ear to yourself. . . . Fasting bears no fruit unless it is watered by mercy. Fasting dries up when mercy dries up. Mercy is to fasting as rain to the earth. However much you cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices, show virtues, if you do not release the springs of mercy, your fasting will bear no fruit. When you fast, if you mercy is thin your harvest will be thin; when you fast, what you pour out in mercy overflows into your barn. Therefore, do not lose by saving, but gathering by scattering. Give to the poor, and you give to yourself. You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others."



## STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

In today's Scripture reading from the Book of Leviticus, the Lord tells Moses and Aaron how to delicately handle those who have contracted leprosy in the camp. In St. Mark's Gospel, Jesus shows great compassion to a leper who asks Christ to make him "clean." In spite of Christ's instruction not to, the man publicly proclaims the miracle of his healing. St. Paul instructs us to give glory to God in everything we do and to imitate Christ in all things. As Jesus' disciples, how do we show compassion and love to the outcasts of our day? Consider offering time at a local soup kitchen or homeless shelter serving our less fortunate brothers and sisters.


