





Thank You, Thank You, to the Knights of Columbus for putting on a pancake breakfast to raise money for our Conference, and to our parish members for being so generous. Thanks to all of you they raised \$1500, which will be put to good use.

Since I wrote you last, we have visited 11 families and provided \$785 in rent, \$1290 in Consumers bills, \$918 in DTE bills, and given out \$200 in Kroger and Meijer cards to be used for milk and perishables, diapers and gasoline. We also gave out 19 bags of food and paid \$54.16 so someone could get their prescription filled.

Our boundaries cover the three hotels on Grand River and lots of times those clients need food. We sure could use some non-frozen microwaveable food for the pantry (stews, soups, pasta, etc.). So if you happen to be shopping and some of these items are on sale, pick up one or more for us. As always, we thank you for your generosity. Without your help these families would not receive aid from us.

#### **STEWARDSHIP MOMENT**

In his Gospel, St. John describes the common link in today's Scripture passages that is also a significant theme throughout the Bible: God's infinite love for us. For God so loved the world that he gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life (John 3:16). The Second Book of Chronicles illustrates how God, following the Israelites' exile to Babylon due to grave sin, mercifully invites them home through an edict of King Cyrus of Persia. In St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, he reminds us of God's love and mercy through Christ even when we are dead in our transgressions. No sin is too great that it cannot be forgiven by our Lord through the sacrament of Reconciliation. If you have not been to confession in a while, return with a contrite heart during Lent for forgiveness that will rekindle your discipleship in the Lord and give you peace.
