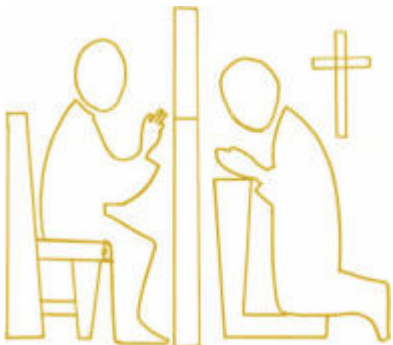

OPLATEK OR "CHRISTMAS WAFER"



The **Christmas wafer** is a Central European Christian Christmas tradition celebrated in Polish, Slovak, Lithuanian and Italian families during Wigilia (Christmas Eve Vigil). The unleavened wafers are baked from pure wheat flour and water, are usually rectangular in shape and very thin; they are identical in composition to the Host used during a Catholic mass however, they are not consecrated. Wafers are embossed with Christmas related religious images, varying from the nativity scene, especially Virgin Mary with baby Jesus, to the Star of Bethlehem. Family members and friends break off a small piece of the oplatek wafer and give it to one another along with a blessing. Breaking off and exchanging part of oplatek with someone is symbol of forgiveness between two people and is meant to remind participants of the importance of Christmas, God, and family. The tradition of sharing the wafer is one of the rich variety of traditions that Poles still celebrate during **Christmas Eve Supper**, which is the most elegant and pompous evening in the whole year. Why not start a new tradition this year. Oplateks are available in the Parish Office and are available after all the Masses this weekend and December 15/16. A Free Will donation is not required, but would be appreciated!



Knights Corner

Supreme Council Webinar Dec. 11 Focuses on the Faith in Action Program

Members and officers are urged to take part in a new webinar being offered December 11 by the Supreme K of C Council. The hour long webinar will discuss “how The Faith in Action program is your plan to let the parish community know that your council are men of faith and of action and is geared to every council member and officer.” The webinar will be available live at 8:30 PM on December 11. Pre-registration is required at www.kofc.org. If that time is not convenient, it is available on demand at any time through the Supreme website at no cost.

The Supreme Council’s Faith in Action manual notes that Pope Francis has invited “Christians everywhere ... to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ”. The manual notes “The Faith in Action program model extends the same invitation to Knights of Columbus members and their families. It is a renewed personal invitation to live out the calling of their faith, the call to service of their neighbor and to answer the age old question, ‘Am I my brother’s keeper?’”

As Supreme Knight Carl Anderson has said, “If we can’t meet young Catholic men where they are, they will go somewhere else. And, in this era, it is too easy to go somewhere else when we need them to be home. Home in the Catholic Church, home in their parishes and home with their families.”

The manual notes “The Faith in Action model is a realization of the changing needs of men in the twenty-first century. It seeks to balance all our key priorities with theirs – Faith, Family, Community and Life – and present them in a way that is clear to our leaders, members and prospective Knights.” You will hear more on this theme as the fraternal year unfolds.

In case you haven’t noticed, your TV and car radio drone on about wishing you “Happy Holidays.” All very neutral and inoffensive. But Christmas is a religious holiday that celebrates the birth of Jesus. As Catholics and Knights it is our duty to remind the world of that fact. This year we are offering a magnetic car decals showing a manger and bearing the legend “Keep Christ in Christmas.” Brother Brian Gulick is leading this effort. 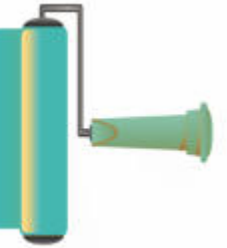
