



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP


When I was a child, I often thought of the Church as something mystical and supernatural. I wasn't wrong in my understanding of the Body of Christ, for surely the Church has these characteristics. However, even though we speak about the foundation of all we are as Church being the "mystery of Christ," Jesus became a man so that supernatural element could break into the natural world in a profound way. What we once could not see, we now see. What we saw as a God in a distant place now dwelt among us. It is one of the aspects of Catholicism that I have grown to appreciate the most as I have matured: for a Catholic, the supernatural is natural. The communion of saints is heavenly and earthly at the same time.

The Beatitudes instruct us about this reality. Pope Francis reminds us that holiness is "not about swooning in mystic rapture." Holiness is about living in the real world and doing extraordinary things with our ordinary lives. Our stewardship way of life consists of actions in the natural world that have extraordinary repercussions. Do not ever take your simple actions of generosity and love for granted. As disciples called to a life of stewardship, we participate in something more profound than what we can see. We are blessed to be called to follow Jesus, and we bring blessing to all those with whom we choose to share ourselves. *-Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS*

We will be publishing a reflection from each chapter of *The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity* book by Matthew Kelly.

Here is Chapter 2 "Your Happiness Project".

"In some ways life is a happiness project. The project is full of paradoxes. For example, it may seem like its about you, but it's actually more about what you can do for

other people.

It turns out that bringing happiness to other people increases your chance of being happy, while seeking happiness yourself decreases those chances."

What a powerful paragraph! In our world today, where most people live selfishly, there seems to be more unhappiness generated.

On Page 7, Matthew Kelly shares a list of truths in his quest for happiness. These facts can be helpful to everyone.

- Happiness and pleasure are not the same thing.
- Getting what I want doesn't make me happy.
- Focusing on myself almost never leads to happiness.
- I am never happy when I pretend to be someone I am not.
- -Too much of the happiness I experience is dependent on unsustainable circumstances or situations.
- The more I help others in their quest for lasting happiness, the happier I seem to be.
- Lying never makes me happy.
- Happiness is always found by embracing the present moment.
- It is impossible to be grateful and unhappy at the same time.
- Anything that helps me become a-better-version-of-myself makes me happy, even if it is difficult or painful.
- Happiness is contagious.

The question is asked, "Do you believe it is possible to be happier than you have ever been at any other time in your life?"

One must think about that and reflect. God wants you to experience happiness in your life. We must stay open to His plan. We must fight against the criticism, lies, manipulation, greed, and competition of the world around us. We must identify with Jesus and live in truth and love; even when its hard to do so.

Knights Corner

Faith in Action Kiosk Offers Lots of Good Reading Including "Becoming a Real Man of Good" Booklet

If you haven't visited the new Council's Faith in Action kiosk in the main entrance of the Church, you are urged to do so. One of the free booklets of special interest to Council members is "Becoming a Real Man of God" by Fr. Roger L. Landry. In his introduction, Fr. Landry notes that "Over the past several decades, for many reasons, men have been suffering an identity crisis. Whereas in former days, a son would clearly have grasped his father's instructions, 'Show yourself a man,' today such a curt instruction might not be so readily understood. The messages our culture broadcasts about what it means to be a 'real man' are inconsistent and confusing.

"In movies and on television, the images of men vary widely from violent, take-no-prisoner pseudo-superheroes, to smooth-talking, machismo-driven womanizers, to sheepish and vulnerable women-fearers who seem to want to be one of the girls more than one of the guys." He laments that "Rare is the positive image of ordinary, hard-working men who are faithful to God, to the Church, to their wives and to their families and friends."

He offers insights on true love and explains how men and women love differently. He also suggests St. Joseph as a role model of authentic masculine love, noting that St. Joseph was a protector, a provider, a model of chaste love and a man of action. He goes on to explain the challenges to raising boys to be true men of God.

Other booklets of particular interest to our members include *The Gift of Fatherhood, God's Plan for Love and Marriage, The Family in the Modern World and Into the Breech.*
