Get to Know Jesus

When I speak and write, I mention my family quite often. Those of you who have been reading these reflections for the past 5+ years — or who have read my books — may think you know them. When I travel, I do get asked about my family by those who have entered my life through the words on a page. My hope is that by sharing stories about my family and life the reader gets a chance to see himself or herself in the story as well. Then the point being made in the article or reflection can take on stronger meaning because it hits home. However, no matter how much I write about my family and how much you read about them, you will only have a glimpse as to the real people. It will take an actual relationship with one of them to get you to the point where you can say you know them.

That is the same way with Jesus. First, more Catholics need to read more and learn more about Jesus. Bible studies should be the norm and not the exception in our lives. Second, too many of us in the Church can explain who Jesus is from our past formation classes and reading, but we do not actually know him. Jesus is not a topic, a theological term, or simply a historical figure. He is a real being who is alive! He is not dead, but alive! He calls us to do more than read about him. He calls us into an intimate relationship with him. We grow in relationship with Jesus by worshipping at the Mass, spending time with him in adoration, resting in him in the quiet, and by having the Jesus in us meet the Jesus in others. If you do not know him personally, get to know him. I would love for you all to meet my family in person someday, but I would much rather you get to know Jesus instead.

Knights Corner

Grand Knight Bednarski Cited for Leadership that Earned Star Council Award; Smiths Honored for Continued Activity

Congratulations to GK Dave Bednarski who is the August Knight of the Month and to PGK Rich and Lynn Smith who are the August Family of the Month. Dave is being honored for leading the Council this past fraternal year as the Council was awarded the Order's highest honor – Star Council. We also gained six new members and accomplished several charitable efforts. The Star Council award is the sixth in our 14 year history. He also is active in our Council's support at the Noon Mass on the first Sunday of the month.

The Smiths are among the most active Knight families. Rich is our Membership Director and also sets up our annual Memorial Mass, leads the five Casino bus trips, and coordinates our Christmas sweatshirt drives. As past Grand Knight, he led the Council in winning three Star Council awards. Lynn is a Eucharistic Minister, serving our parish and the Botsford shut-ins. She also has been a long-time Board member of the Mother and Unborn Baby Pregnancy Center.

Michigan's 57th ultrasound machine sponsored by the Knights was dedicated in July at the Pregnancy Center of Lapeer. Under this national program, a local council or councils raise half the cost of a machine – an estimated \$20,000 – and the Supreme Council supplies the other half. In this case, the Fr. Goentges Council #1987 of Lapeer was joined by North Branch Area Council #9568 and Our Lady Queen of Peace Council #4556 of Imlay City. Once a machine goes into operation, Knights provide funds to keep it running.

The Michigan Council announced that it will not be sponsoring a bus to the 47th Annual March for Life in Washington, D.C., January 24-26, 2020. Noting that many local organizations sponsor their own transportation. The Council decided to scrap its bus. However, it will continue sponsoring lodging. The State Council negotiated a \$109 cost per night for rooms at the Hampton Inn in Old Towne Alexandria, VA beginning Friday, January 24 through Sunday, January 26. Reservations should be made directly by telephone no later than Christmas Day to the Inn at 1-703-329-1400 under the Michigan State Council name. The State Council warns the low rate will not be available on-line.

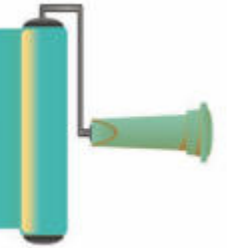
