





OPLATEK OR "CHRISTMAS WAFER"

The Christmas wafer is a Central European Christian Christmas tradition celebrated in <u>Polish</u>, <u>Slovak</u>, <u>Lithuanian</u> and <u>Italian</u> families during <u>Wigilia</u> (*Christmas Eve Vigil*). The <u>unleavened</u> wafers are baked from pure wheat flour and water, are usually rectangular in shape and very thin; they are identical in composition to the Host used during a Catholic mass however, they are not consecrated. Wafers are embossed with Christmas related religious images, varying from the nativity scene, especially Virgin Mary with baby Jesus, to the Star of Bethlehem. Family members and friends break off a small piece of the *oplatek* wafer and give it to one another along with a blessing. Breaking off and exchanging part of oplatek with someone is symbol of forgiveness between two people and is meant to remind participants of the importance of Christmas, God, and family. The tradition of sharing the wafer is one of the rich variety of traditions that Poles still celebrate during Christmas Eve Supper, which is the most elegant and pompous evening in the whole year. Why not start a new tradition this year. Oplateks are available in the Parish Office and will be available after all the Masses on the weekends of December 7/8 and December 14/15. A Free Will donation is not required, but would be appreciated!

The word Advent means coming.

In the early church Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of the Epiphany. Christians would spend 40 days in penance prayer and fasting in preparation of this celebration. It wasn't until the 6th century, that Roman Christians tied Advent to the coming of Christ. Not the first coming in Bethlehem, rather his second coming. It wasn't until the Middle Ages that the Advent season was explicitly linked to Christ's first coming at Christmas.

This year Advent begins on December 1st and lasts for four Sundays. Let's not get "wrapped up" in the commercialism of the holiday season, rather let's be a part of the CHRISTmas season.

ADVENT WREATH AND CANDLES

The first Advent wreath was from a Lutheran minister working at a mission for children in Germany in 1829. He used a wheel from a cart and placed twenty small red candles and four large white candles inside the ring. The small candles were lit on weekdays and the white candles on Sundays.

Today the Advent wreath is often made of evergreens to symbolize everlasting life. The circle, like a ring, reminds us of God's unending love and eternal life. The candles used today are *usually* three purple/violet with the third Sunday being rose-colored/pink. Purple symbolizes repentance and fasting but is also the color of royalty. The sovereignty of Christ and our anticipation of the coming King. Rose represents joy, moving us away from repentance towards rejoicing.

The first candle is the Prophecy Candle or Candle of Hope. The second, is the Bethlehem Candle or Candle of Preparation. The third, lit on Gaudete Sunday is the Shepherd Candle or Candle of Joy. And the fourth is the Angel Candle or Candle of Love. Sometimes a White Candle is placed in the center of the wreath representing purity and light and lit on Christmas Day. It is the Christ Candle, the sinless, spotless, pure Savior. Those who receive Jesus as Savior are washed of their sins and made whiter than snow.

Knights Serve Dinner At Advent Tea Tuesday Then Officers Meet For Regular December Session Some of our Knights will be serving dinner Tuesday at the annual Advent Tea, Later in the evening the Council officers will hold their monthly meeting. Serving at the Tea is one of several times during the year that Knights help other parish organizations with their projects.

We also cook at the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper, at the Lenten Soup Supper, the Parish Picnic and Halloween's Trunk 'n' Treat. Knights also serve the parish as ushers. Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors and on various commissions and committees. Service to others and charity is what we do. Our Order sums it up with the motto "Service to One, Service to All."

The deadline for the Holy Cross Services Christmas sweatshirts is just a week away. PGK Rich Smith who is coordinating the drive warned that the last day to provide a gift sweatshirt is December 8. "If possible, please giftwrap the shirts and mark the size on the outside as well as indicating if the shirt is for a boy or a girl - Sizes XL and up are preferred.

Smith also announced the 2020 schedule for the Knights sponsored bus trips to the Fire Keepers casino outside of Battle Creek. The trips are scheduled for January 8, March 11, June 17, August 12 and November 11. The current cost is \$35 per person which is offset by a \$5 food credit and a \$20 playing credit. That results in a net cost of \$10 for a roundtrip ride in a comfortable coach. The bus leaves the church parking lot at 9 AM and returns at 6 PM or so.

Brother Seabolt was cited for his consistent help on many Council projects and on assisting with the work of the parish Health Ministry, headed by wife Barbara. He is our Program Director, the author of this weekly Knights Corner article and producer of the monthly meeting agendas and the yearly Action Calendar.
